Cape Town—by Cristina Silva

The 15th IUFoST World conference on Food Science and Technology held in Cape Town (South Africa) on 22-26 August 2010 was an important venue to disseminate the ISEKI_Food projects and activities of the ISEKI_Food

The ISEKI_Food projects and network at the IUFoST 2010 conference in

The IUFoST organising committee invited Cristina Silva and Paola Pittia to chair the session "Food Science & Technology Education Development" that started with an oral presentation of our project coordinator entitled "The ISEKI_Food Network: role in food studies and careers in an evolving world".

Thanks to the contribution of the ISEKI_Food partners, three posters based on the activities and outputs of the network were also presented ("Development of innovative food study materials by ISEKI_Food 3 and ISEKI_Mundus 2 network"; "State of the art of the food studies in Europe and in the World: the results of the ISEKI_Food network"; and "The Food4us game"). A poster focused on the main aims and activities of the TRACK_FAST project was also presented.

During the conference, the dissemination of the network was kindly supported by some ISEKI_Food partners including Elisabeth Dumoulin, Margarida Vieira, Helmut Glattes, Harris Lazarides, Marco Dalla Rosa, Stephan Drusch and Afam Israel Jideani, who recently moved from Botswana to the University of Venda and welcomed all the ISEKI Food friends in South Africa.

More than 1700 food scientists, technologists and food industry experts from around the world, attended this international event which also hosted an exhibition of food industries and related activities.



WP7 Fostering lifelong learning in Higher Education: EMPLOYABILITY- by Rui Costa

Employability is a vital concern of the Bologna Process. Ministerial communiqués include many references to employability since this is a subject important for both the education and for the employment ministries. Employability approaches to curricula design have mainly two dimensions: knowledge of the employment market needs and the application of pedagogical approaches on the development of personal competences that are particularly valued by employers. ISEKI_Food3 wants to collect the diverse methodologies across European higher education institutions when it comes to include employability approaches to curricula design. WP7 prepared a short questionnaire to be answered by its 76 higher education institutions. Track_Fast (TF) project – Training Requirements and Careers for Knowledge-based Food Science and Technology in Europe – continues keeping up the good work to achieve its goals



A series of questionnaires were administered to FST employers throughout Europe in order to determine the current situation of FST professionals in terms of competencies and their acquisition. The first stage results are being presented in a series of brainstorming workshops across the EU engaging FST employers in order to assess their profile of the ideal FST. **Twelve Brainstorming Workshops** had already taken place and more 4 will be hold. At www.trackfast.eu there is an agenda with the next Brainstorming Workshops that will take place in Netherlands, Hungary, Turkey and Portugal.

Track_Fast project was presented on the **2**nd **ISEKI_Food projects Overall Meeting**, that occurred in Wageningen (June 7th 2010), by Paola Pittia from Università di Teramo.

This project was also presented, through posters at: **IUFoST -** 15th World Congress of Food Science and Technology - in Cape Town (August 22-26) and **Food Factory 2010** - 5th International Conference on the Food Factory for the Future - in Gothenburg (June 30th to July 2nd), by Cristina L. M. Silva from College of Biotechnology - Catholic University of Portugal.

Next 29th September- 1st October 2010 the **3rd Track_Fast Meeting** will be hosted by TUB - Technical University Berlin (Department of Food Biotechnology and Food Process Engineering) in Berlin.

Many of the results already collected within Track_Fast consortia will be presented at **FoodInnova**, International Conference on Food Innovation, next 25th to 29th October 2010 in Valencia (Spain).

These project activities will contribute to a more innovative and competitive food and drink sector, which is a key area for job creation, global competition and societal benefit in Europe.

2nd overall meeting of the ISEKI projects, Wageningen, NL - by Lynn McIntyre (UK)

The second overall meeting of ISEKI_Food 3 and ISEKI_Mundus 2 was held at Wageningen University in the Netherlands from the 7th to 9th June 2010. A total of 95 partners, representing 27 ISEKI_Food 3 and 19 ISEKI_Mundus 2 countries, were in attendance including external evaluator Klaus Guthy. The meeting was timely as we had just received feedback from our EC project reports submitted in March and April. Both projects were evaluated favourably but Klaus reminded us that the success of the projects relies on the continuing support and activity of all partners, and encouraged everyone to participate as fully as possible to achieve the outcomes of the projects.

The first morning of the meeting was devoted to formal introductions by Prof Dr Martin Kropff, the rector of Wageningen University, and the meeting organiser Dr Ralf Hartemin. Project coordinator Dr Cristina Silva then provided a summary of project outputs and project administration before encouraging us as always to work hard! Over the next day and a half, various presentations were made by work package coordinators to summarise project progress, and to update partners on the 2nd ISEKI_Food Conference. A number of parallel sessions were also held on days 2 and 3 to allow partners to contribute to and progress work package activities. The meeting also included a memorable bike ride to the Wageningen Food Science Department where we toured their research facilities, a traditional dutch pancake dinner and a trip to the zoo where partners cooked their own meat on a huge revolving grill. I'm happy to report (to the best of my knowledge anyway) that no-one suffered food poisoning as a consequence of poor BBQ technique!

As always, it was an enjoyable, hard working and productive three days, and the project outputs are progressing well. Thanks go to Ralph Hartemink and the staff and students of Wageningen University, and to the invited speakers (Linze Rijswijk) and partners (Paola Pittia, Marco Dalla Rossa, Rui Costa and Ingrid Bauman) who contributed additional presentations of interest to the network. The third and final overall meeting of the ISEKI_Food 3 and ISEKI_Mundus 2 projects will be held in conjunction with the second ISEKI_Food Conference in Milan, Italy from 31st August to 2nd September 2011. There is much to be done before then so please complete your homework requests from the ISEKI secretariat and see you in Italy next year.


International Conference "Employability & Entrepreneurship"

AgriFoodResults has three main objectives:

- To offer innovative and sustainable services for dissemination.

- Two web-sites: one on dissemination practices (for dissemination managers, with guide of good practices, directories of contacts, database of information relays) and one on food scientific results (for end-users, with a database of scientific results in food science).
- An innovative and sustainable web solution for communicating project results.
- Several guides of good practices:
 i) A guide of good practices for the dissemination managers
 ii) A guide of good practices for communication with food SMEs
 iii) A guide of good practices for communication with policy makers
 iV) A guide of good practices for communication with consumers

Several reports including:

i) A report benchmarking current
practices on dissemination of scientific
results in the food sector and identifying the needs of SMEs.

ii) A report on strategies for communication of scientific results.
